2018 BACS NOTES FOR APPLICANTS - TAIWAN HES SCHOLARSHIP -

All applications must be submitted electronically via email. Please note

- Slightly different arrangements apply to independent applicants and to 'departmental' applicants (i.e. applicants coming through a University department with a BACS co-ordinator) see details below;
- Applications that are late, incomplete, or submitted in an incorrect format cannot be considered;
- ALL APPLICATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE SELECTORS BY END MARCH 23, 2018
 - o **Independent applicants** must ensure that application documents and references are submitted to this deadline;
 - Departmental applicants must ensure that application documents and references are submitted to an earlier internal deadline (to be confirmed by departmental co-ordinators) so that their applications can be forwarded to the selectors to the March 23 deadline.

Read these notes and the "Foreign Student Information for UK Applicants" by the Education Division, Taipei Representative Office (TRO) in the UK carefully before completing the application form.

The BACS-Taiwan language scholarships provide a monthly stipend of NT\$25,000. Scholarship funds must be used to pay for registration and course fees at approved language centres/universities in Taiwan. The remainder of the grant represents a contribution towards maintenance costs.

Eligibility (Please refer also to Section 4 of the "Foreign Student Information for UK Applicants" issued by TRO.)

- 1. The language scholarships are open to those holding a full UK passport, above the age of 18, who possess A-Levels (or equivalent qualifications) or above with an excellent academic record and are of good moral character. Non-UK nationals studying or living in the UK will have to apply through offices in their respective countries. A list of these is available on request from the TRO Education Division (for address, see below).
- 2. Applicants studying Chinese at any level are encouraged to apply.
- 3. Students who are currently studying Mandarin in Taiwan during the HES scholarship application period (1st Feb 31 March); or who hold or have held in the past any form of government scholarship in Taiwan are NOT eligible.
- 4. Applicants must be able to pay for their own return airfare to Taiwan in order to be considered for the scholarship.

Application procedure

All applications must include the following (See checklist below)

- 1. An official application form. This must include
 - a. a statement explaining your reasons for wanting to study in Taiwan (Point 8 in the application form; maximum length 400 words);
 - b. a digital colour photograph (inserted into the application form on p.2).
- 2. A scanned copy of a valid UK passport.
- 3. **Proof of application to a recognised language centre in Taiwan** (e.g. an email from the language centre's admissions department acknowledging the receipt of your application). Visit the following website for a list of language centres recognised by the MoE in Taiwan: http://english.moe.gov.tw/ct.asp?xltem=14462&CtNode=11424&mp=1
- 4. Scanned copies of the certificates of his/her highest academic qualification (i.e. degree certificate or A-Level certificates). Current university students who have not yet graduated should include a copy of their most recent transcript of study.

a. For independent applicants who have not had formal learning of the Chinese language but have taken HSK or TOCFL tests, please also submit a scanned copy of the test results.

These items must be submitted as a single file, identified by the applicant's name, *e.g.* <WALEY Arthur HES application>.

- **5. Two confidential references must be supplied by all applicants.** Please email a Confidential Reference Form to each of your referees, and ensure that they are aware of the deadline.
 - a. All references must be submitted on the standard form
 - b. **Each reference filename MUST include the applicant's and the referee's names**: <WALEY Arthur HES reference GILES>
 - c. **Departmental applicants**: ask your referees to email the completed forms directly to your departmental contact (your department will inform you of the right email address), who will forward these to BACS.
 - d. **Independent applicants**: please ask your referees to email completed forms directly to: bacs.huayuscholarship@gmail.com References supplied by applicants are not acceptable.
 - e. **Please note**: it is each applicant's responsibility to make sure that two references are supplied. We regret that BACS cannot contact applicants/referees for missing references.

6. Where to send your application:

- a. **Departmental applicants**: submit applications to your department's BACS co-ordinator by the internal departmental deadline (which your department will communicate to you);
- b. **Independent applicants**: email applications direct to: bacs.huayuscholarship@gmail.com by end March 23, 2018
